World Health Organization guidelines for postnatal care include routine postpartum evaluation of all women and infant dyads at 3 days, 1-2 weeks, and 6 weeks 32. The National Institute for Health and Care Excellence guidelines recommend screening all women for resolution of the "Baby Blues" at 10-14 days after birth to facilitate early identification of and treatment for postpartum ...

Healthy women 21 - 24 yr • No HPV testing recommended , if normal Pap rescreen every three yrs • If unsatisfactory pap then repeat pap after 2-4 months - If Negative then routine ...

### Pap Smear Referral Guideline

Other reported Pap smear results, such as infections or atypical cells, are explained in detail in the next section: Understanding Your Pap Smear (Pap Test) Report. If a Pap smear is performed without an HPV test , the presence of abnormal cervical cells may indicate the need to perform an HPV test to determine whether HPV infection is the cause of the cellular changes.
