Probability trees are similar to frequency trees, but we instead put the probabilities on the branches and the events at the end of the branch.. Example: A bag contains 4 red balls and 5 blue balls. Raheem picks 2 balls at random.. Calculate the probability that he selects the same coloured ball each time, given that after each time a ball is selected, it is replaced.
